**Two Special Collections This Week**

On **Holy Thursday** at the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper, the Church directs that the collection be given to the poor and needy of the local community. This year we have designated Catholic Charities—St. Augustine Bureau as the beneficiary of this collection in recognition of the work they continue to do to assist families in the recovery from Hurricane Matthew.

On **Good Friday** the annual Pontifical Collection for the Shrines in the Holy Land is taken up at the 3:00 p.m. Solemn Liturgy of the Lord's Passion. Because of wars and instability in and around the Holy Land, Pope Francis has asked us to be generous in this year's collection so as to assist Christians trying to maintain the presence of Christ there. Our gifts assist the Franciscans who care for the Holy Shrines and also help refugees, especially from Syria.

❖ **Divine Mercy Novena in preparation for Divine Mercy Sunday**

The Divine Mercy Novena begins on Good Friday, April 14, 2017, and is prayed for 9 days leading up to Divine Mercy Sunday (the Second Sunday of Easter), April 23, 2017. Novena prayers can be found online at EWTN.com or DivineMercy.org. We encourage you to pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet, if possible at 3:00 p.m. ("the Hour of Mercy"), each day of the novena. Please join us at 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 23 (Divine Mercy Sunday) at Saint Benedict the Moor Church where we will celebrate a Holy Hour in honor of Divine Mercy.

❖ **Preparing for the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima**

A common question that comes to priests from their parishioners and others is, "How can I grow in holiness?" One way comes from Pope Saint John Paul II who popularized the saying "To Jesus, through Mary."

We are inviting members of our parish to participate in a "33-Day Preparation for Consecration to Mary" which will culminate on Saturday, May 13, the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Blessed Mother's apparitions at Fatima. Copies of *33 Days to Morning Glory* will be available at the doors of the church for individuals and families who desire to join in this spiritual exercise. For those who choose to participate, the final prayer of Consecration will be prayed at our parish's observance of Fatima's Centennial on May 13 at 12:00 noon in the Cathedral.

❖ **Try Alpha! – New session starts the week of April 17<sup>th</sup>**

Alpha is an eleven-week program that invites participants to encounter Jesus in a new and personal way. If you already have a deep relationship with Him, consider helping others come to faith by inviting someone you know who doesn't know God or is far away from Christ and His Church.

The format is an open, non-judgmental discussion of key faith topics. Each session begins with a meal and relaxed conversation. Afterwards, the group views a video presentation followed by discussion. Hosts will be with each small group to ensure that everyone can express what is on their mind and stay on topic.

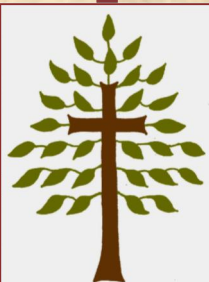

❖ **Stewardship reflection for Palm Sunday**

Most of us know today as Palm Sunday, although officially in the Church it is called Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion, and to many Church leaders it is simply Passion Sunday, which comes from the Latin name for it, *Dominica Passionis*. We have reflected on this day how the liturgy begins with great joy and becomes more and more somber with the reading of the Passion.

During the procession of the palms Jesus arrives in Jerusalem to great tumult and rejoicing as the people cry out "Hosanna... blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, hosanna in the highest." As the Mass progresses we get an overview of what is to occur during this holiest of weeks, including the institution of the Eucharist, the passion and death of the Lord, the prediction of His Resurrection, and then His Resurrection itself.

Imagine the confusion of the twelve Apostles. Jesus has been spending time with them in the recent weeks prior to the Passion trying to get them to understand that His time of suffering was near and approaching, and that is the reason He must go to Jerusalem. And here is the crowd welcoming and praising and laughing and celebrating His presence.

We are not much different in many ways, but now is the time for us to really embrace and understand the sacrifice the Lord made for each of us, and the incredible gift He has given us. In the coming days we must take the chance to truly rededicate ourselves to being His disciples.

**Touch the hearts of those who look only for gain at the expense of the poor of the earth. Teach us to discover the worth of each thing, to be filled with awe and contemplation, to recognize that we are profoundly united with every creature as we journey towards your infinite light.**

❖ **On the bulletin cover: Entry of Christ into Jerusalem, James Tissot**

Jacques Joseph Tissot (Anglicized as James Tissot), was a French painter and illustrator. In 1885, Tissot experienced a revival of his Catholic faith, which led him to spend the rest of his life making paintings illustrating Biblical events. To assist in his completion of Biblical illustrations, Tissot traveled to the Middle East in 1886, 1889, and 1896 to make studies of the landscape and people. His series of 365 watercolor illustrations depicting the life of Christ was shown to critical acclaim and enthusiastic audiences in Paris, London, and New York, before being bought by the Brooklyn Museum in 1900. They were published in a French edition in 1896-7 and in an English one in 1897-8, bringing Tissot vast wealth and fame.

### Cathedral Parish Parking: **TRUE OR FALSE?**

*If I have a parish parking permit, I can leave my vehicle in the "Bank of America lot" after Mass.*

**PARTIALLY TRUE.** Parishioners do not have to rush to their vehicles after Mass. A limited amount of time is allowed for visiting after Mass or for coffee and donuts, etc. For the 5 p.m. Masses, vehicles must exit the lot by 6:45 p.m.; 7 a.m. Mass by 8:45 a.m.; 9 a.m. Mass by 10:45 a.m.; and 11 a.m. Mass by 12:45 p.m. Vehicles left in the lot after those times will be required to pay when exiting the lot.
