❖New Votive Candles for the Cathedral

You will notice we have changed the votive candles in the Cathedral Basilica. The "Saint Killian's Votive Candle System" will allow us to provide you and our visitors with a way of almost always being able to light a votive (prayer) candle. As each candle is lit and burns, it eventually falls into a water tank that is built into the stand. A rack of new candles will be available so that you can place one in an empty space in the rack and light your votive candle. This system not only helps you to have candles available but also is better for the environment as it reduces waste and burns cleaner than our previous votive candles.

[P.N. – The larger 3-day votive candles will no longer be available with this new system. If you wish the multiple day votive candles, we suggest you go to the Mission *Nombre de Dios* on San Marco Ave.]

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

On this Lord's Day at the 9:00 a.m. Mass, we will celebrate the Rite of Acceptance into the Order of Catechumens for several people who officially begin with us a time of spiritual and religious growth in the Catholic faith. The word *catechumen* comes from the Greek meaning "one who is a learner" or "one who desires to learn a specific way of living." At one point in ancient Greece, the term was used for those who wanted to learn from the philosophers of the time. Since at least the late first century A.D., it has been used by the Christian Church to name those who have not been baptized into the Paschal Mystery of Christ's Death and Resurrection, yet sense that the Spirit of God is moving in their lives to bring them to life in Christ.

Also, this is Deacon John Sollee's final Sunday with us. His joy of heart and zeal for bringing the Good News of Jesus has been an inspiration to many in our parish community. Thank you, Deacon John, for these past two months with us and be assured of our prayers as you prepare in the next ten months for ordination to the Priesthood.

Finally, with much joy, we will bless our two parishioners who will begin their journey of discernment in the seminary later this week. At the 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. Masses and the 5:00 p.m. Mass we will ask God's favor on Filippo Schiavo and Michael Hines as they will travel to St. John Vianney College Seminary in Miami later this week. Along with three other new seminarians from our Diocese they will use this time to not only start college, but also by the discipline of seminary life, discern God's call for each of them. Please remember them in your prayers.



Stewardship reflection for the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord

The Book of Daniel, from which our First Reading is drawn, was written some two centuries before the birth of Christ. This is only significant in that many of the prophets (Daniel is considered one of the major prophets) lived as many as six centuries before Christ. However, regardless

the timeline, we need to be moved by and appreciative of the prophecies we find in the Old Testament. In the particular passage in today's reading it states, "The one like a Son of Man received dominion, glory, and kingship."

Today, of course, is the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord, and this reading very much parallels what is portrayed in the Transfiguration. The interesting point within this reading from Daniel, however, is that it refers to the "Son of Man," which is the term lesus Himself used most often to describe Himself.

We have referenced this fact previously. In fact, the term "Son of Man" occurs 85 times in the Gospels, and in 83 of them it is Jesus who uses the term. (It appears 32 times in Matthew; 15 times in Mark; 26 times in Luke; and 12 times in John, and it is in John where it is used twice by someone other than Jesus.)

The important point for us is that Jesus calling Himself the Son of Man explains that He was born of a woman, and He shares in our earthly conditions and sufferings. That fact should make us want to embrace Him as our Savior, our Friend, and our Shepherd even more.

Centering prayer is a method of silent prayer that prepares us to receive the gift of contemplative prayer, in which we experience God's presence within us, closer than breathing, closer than thinking, closer than consciousness itself. 
