





PARTIALLY TRUE. Parishioners do not have to rush to their vehicles after Mass. A limited amount of time is allowed for visiting after Mass or for coffee and donuts, etc. For the 5 p.m. Masses, vehicles must exit the lot by 6:45 p.m.; 7 a.m. Mass by 8:45 a.m.; 9 a.m. Mass by 10:45 a.m.; and 11 a.m. Mass by 12:45 p.m. Vehicles left in the lot after those times will be required to pay when exiting the lot.

Cathedral Parish Early Education Center (CPEEC) will begin registration for our

current CPEEC families for the 2018-2019 school year January 8, 2018. We will open registration to all others on January 22. One-year-old, two-year-old, three-year-old and Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) classes are available. The VPK program is designed to prepare children for kindergarten and build the foundation for their educational success. VPK extends eligibility for four year olds with birthdays February 2 through September 1. Parents may enroll their child in the state's free VPK educational program that year or wait until the following year when their child is five, providing they are a resident of Florida. Therefore, if your child turns 4 anytime from 2/2/17 through 9/1/18 he or she may participate in the VPK program for the 2018-2019 school year. Care beyond the VPK hours is additional. Space in all classes is limited. Please telephone CPEEC at (904) 829-2933 to secure your spot!

Stewardship reflection for the Fourth Sunday of Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel Reading from St. Mark, it is reported that Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach, but His teaching was somewhat different from that normally heard there "for he taught with authority and not as the scribes." Often those who taught in Jesus' time (the scribes) simply quoted others, a variety of Rabbis.

However, Jesus taught with authority because He had authority. Jesus' divine message was not quoting other humans, but quoting God. Jesus was One with God so He knew what He was talking about. Jesus taught with authority because He believed what He was teaching. He was familiar with the information which allowed Him to teach boldly. People listening could perceive that this was someone Who knew.

Up until this time we have seen the Lord as the Son of Man Who submitted to His Father. He submitted to God in His Baptism, and to the Holy Spirit in the wilderness. To have authority also requires submission. We, too, are called to submit to God, but for us that is sometimes challenging because it requires humility, something that is not easy for many of us.

Later in the Gospel of John there is another account of the Lord teaching at the Temple. He is challenged, and His response is quite simply, "My teaching is not from myself; it comes from the one who sent me." We are not divine, but we, too, are sent.


