

Historically the first known celebration of Father's Day was in 1908 in Fairmont, West Virginia as a way of complementing Mother's Day. However, it took until 1966 when President Lyndon Johnson issued a proclamation naming the third Sunday in June as Father's Day. It became the law of the land in 1972 with a bill signed by President Richard Nixon.

Over the years the importance of the father-figure in a family has been supported by both research and just plain common sense. Biblically, the role of the father is often held up as the standard in which a family is truly united in its faith and religious practices as they worship Almighty God. The Knights of Columbus have taken up an effort called "Fathers for Good" to help men be good fathers by balancing home and work life. ≈Reflection on the Gospel reading, June 19, 2016 — Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Once when Jesus was praying in solitude, and the disciples were with him, he asked them, 'Who do the crowds say that I am?' They said in reply, 'John the Baptist; others, Elijah; still others, "One of the ancient prophets has arisen." Then he said to them, 'But who do you say that I am?'" Luke 9:18-20a

One of the wonderful discoveries about our experience of the weekly Liturgy of the Word is the realization that even though the Sunday cycle of proclaimed readings repeats every three years, the Scriptures can always seem new to us. Even though *they* might not change, *we* certainly do.

The simple question that Jesus puts to his disciples in today's Gospel has new meaning in light of the ministry of Pope Francis. More than ever, I hear this question with more urgency and significance. It is not merely about a correct title or a metaphysical or ontological category. Jesus asks his disciples—and us, "Who am I to you? What difference has it made in your life that you have known me and been touched by me?"

Prayer: Lord Jesus, who loved us to death, who embraced us by becoming one of us, let us know you more deeply and follow you more nearly. Give us the courage to take up our crosses and the burdens of those around us, in imitation of you. By losing our lives for your sake, may we be saved. Amen.

We receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings here, or to be godparents or sponsors for the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, and to rightfully enjoy the number of services offered at the Cathedral. Part of that request is to be able to verify that a person is an "active member" of the Cathedral Parish.
