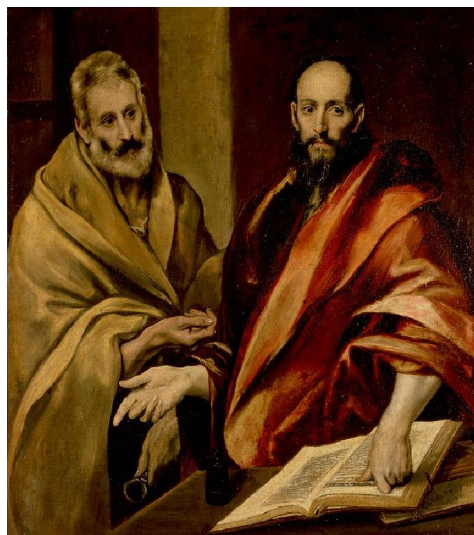

**FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK**

One of the greatest theologians that the Catholic Church has ever known was Saint Thomas Aquinas (c. 1225-1274). His *Summa Theologica* remains one of the greatest works of systematic theology in the very long history of the Church.

A foundational principle for all humans in Thomas' writings, even before coming to belief in God, is the principle of the **common good**. In brief, Thomas holds that whether one believes in God or not, the Almighty has imprinted certain inclinations in every human – one of which is that we are directed to a final end of seeking eternal happiness. Thus, in his words, “good is to be done and pursued, evil is to be avoided.” Among the goods that Thomas holds up as the most important are “to know the truth about God and to live harmoniously in society.” Therefore, to live in society (as a community) together we must seek “the common good which is always superior to the good of the individual.” This has become one of the basic principles of Catholic social teaching.

Over the last several decades, our nation has promoted the rights of individuals over the common good. While God created us in his own “image and likeness” (see Gen 1:26), God placed us in a community (the creation of man and woman) to reflect what Christians have come to believe about God as being One God in a Trinity of Persons. Sin entered the world when Adam and Eve turned in on themselves instead of helping each other avoid sin. All this was further complicated when their son, Cain, slew his brother, Abel. Considering oneself over the good of others becomes the foundation of all sin.

In an election year that also comes within the backdrop of so many high profile tragedies over the last decade and more, what can we as Catholics do to promote the common good? For Saint Thomas, one of the basic questions that society, in general, must ask of itself is how can the best goods – freedom to practice religion, bettering oneself through education, protecting all from enemies and evil – be attained without isolating ourselves from the community?

**May a Roman Catholic receive Holy Communion at another Religious denomination's services?**

This easiest answer to this is "no." However, like everything in law (both church and civil), there are exceptions to the rule.

First, a Catholic may not, under any circumstance, receive Communion in a Protestant church's religious service. This is covered in the Church's Code of Canon Law, canon 844. Just as non-Catholic, Christians are not generally permitted to receive Holy Communion at a Catholic liturgy, neither may Catholics receive at a Protestant church. The Holy See's Instruction *Redemptionis Sacramentum* (issued in March 6448) reiterated this in paragraph 84.

Now for the exception: if a baptized Roman Catholic who has already received first Holy Communion is present for the celebration of the Eucharist in one of the "uniate" Catholic Churches, e.g., Byzantine Catholic, Maronite Catholic, etc., then the Roman Catholic may receive Holy Communion. In the Orthodox Churches, while Roman Catholic law would permit you to receive, the laws of the Orthodox Church do not. So, in this latter case, it is best to check with the Orthodox priest who is the celebrant of the Eucharist to see if he would permit you to receive.

✠ **Stewardship reflection on the Gospel reading,  
Luke 9:51-62 — Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

"No one who sets a hand to the plow, and looks to what was left behind is fit for the Kingdom of God." Jesus was fond of using agricultural terms and images when teaching His Apostles and His followers, and this quote, which comes at the end of our Gospel Reading from Luke today, is an excellent example of that.

In fact, you almost have to have had experience with farming and plowing to understand what it means. It is important for the health and sustenance of crops that the furrows made by a plow, and in which the seeds will be planted, are straight. Whether plowing in Jesus' time either by hand or with a plow pulled by oxen, in order to plow straight rows, someone had to focus on where he was going, not on where he had been. It has not changed with our modern farm equipment today.

In other words, the secret is to look forward, and to assure that you are going in a straight line. Looking back invariably made the person plowing lose focus. That is Jesus' point to us. As good stewards we must keep our focus on Him, on following Him, and on being His disciple. That allows us to move toward our goal of holiness and of being the kind of disciple He wants us to be.

The hospital will no longer give us your name and room number when we visit the hospital unless you request that information be released. We typically send Extraordinary Ministers of Communion, Priests and Deacons to visit and bring Holy Communion. We ask that you not only call or email us at the office when you know you are going to be confined in the hospital, but also when asked by the hospital on admission, state that you are a Catholic and that you would like to see a Chaplain. The only way that you are put on the published hospital visitation list is to do this. And this is the only way that our ministers can find you. Also, as we have always asked, please call or email the office and we will add you to our prayer list. We are very concerned that we are missing you in our visitation and pastoral care.
