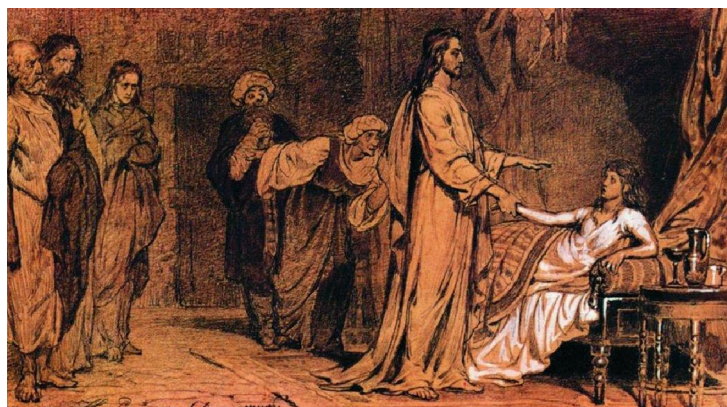

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

[Instead of my own words, here is a part of the United States Bishops' 2012 Statement on Religious Liberty. On the Independence Day weekend, I trust that it speaks to our hearts as Catholic Americans.]

"We are Catholics. We are Americans. We are proud to be both, grateful for the gift which is ours as Christian disciples, and grateful for the gift of liberty which is ours as American citizens. To be Catholic and American should mean not having to choose one over the other. Our allegiances are distinct, but they need not be contradictory. That is the teaching of our Catholic faith, which obliges us to work together with fellow citizens for the common good of all who live in this land. That is the vision of our founding and our Constitution, which guarantees citizens of all religious faiths the right to contribute to our common life together.

"Freedom is not only for Americans, but we think of it as something of our special inheritance, fought for at a great price, and a heritage to be guarded now. We are stewards of this gift, not only for ourselves but for all nations and peoples who yearn to be free. Catholics in America have discharged this duty of guarding freedom admirably for many generations.

"In 1887, when the Archbishop of Baltimore, James Gibbons, was made the second American cardinal, he defended the American heritage of religious liberty during his visit to Rome to receive the red hat. Speaking of the great progress the Catholic Church had made in the United States, he attributed it to the "civil liberty we enjoy in an enlightened republic." Indeed, he made the bolder claim namely that "in the genial atmosphere of liberty [the Church] blossoms like a rose."

✠ **Reflection for the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary**

"As a mother comforts her child, so will I comfort you . . ."

Isaiah 66:13

Over the weekend of June 10, news broke that Pope Francis has raised the liturgical memorial of St. Mary Magdalene to the dignity of a feast, the same rank as the apostles. I was gratified by his desire to raise, in a concrete way, the awareness of the dignity of women in the Church by making this declaration. Unfortunately, at the same time this news became public, the tragic shooting in an Orlando nightclub, killing forty-nine people out of hatred and bigotry, stunned our nation. It was a weekend of building up and of tearing down the dignity of humanity.

The beautiful feminine imagery in this Sunday's first reading brings comfort as we attempt to comprehend such evil in our midst. Isaiah likens God's love to that of a mother who nourishes and gives comfort to her child, who holds her child tenderly in her arms and loves beyond all measure. Yet, earlier in this same chapter, the prophet reminds Israel of the judgment that will be unleashed against those who hate God's Word, who love evil over good, who choose their own ways over God's ways. This juxtaposition of God's overflowing love with just judgment reminds us that while God's tender love is available to all, God's power will prevail over those who choose hate over love.

In these challenging times, let us remember that God's love is stronger than wicked deeds, violence, hatred, bigotry, sexism, racism, and any other "-ism" that seeks to thwart the goodness of humanity. Like a mother's love for her child, God's love for us is abundant and, in the end, will be the final word. Therefore, let us love one another with the love of God: a love that is tender, life-giving, and beyond measure.

Prayer: Lord God, teach us to love. Help us to hold tenderly in our arms those who are relegated to the fringes of society. Stir in our hearts a love that is abundant and unending, that all hatred may cease. Through Christ our Lord.

Cathedral Parish Parking: TRUE OR FALSE?
If I have a parish parking permit, I can park in the "Bank of America lot" any time I want.

FALSE. During bank hours, no parishioner parking is allowed in the westernmost 1/3 of the lot. These spaces are exclusively for parking while banking. Provided there is space available, those with a Cathedral Parish parking permit are allowed to park in the easternmost 2/3 of the "Bank of America lot" for any "scheduled" Cathedral services. "Scheduled" events are only the Mass and Confession times published in the bulletin and those events listed in the "This Week in the Parish" column of the bulletin. There is no free parking for any service that is not published in the bulletin such as weddings, funerals, school Masses, etc.
