



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Immigration has become, unfortunately, a hot-button issue in our nation. Too often we are being pulled to the zealous right and left by the news media who tend to focus on those ends of the spectrum instead of telling a fuller story. It's a very, very complex issue that can't be summarized in a column like this. But let me try to give a basic overview. So, what's a Catholic to do in this maze and mess of a controversial issue?

In the first place, we have to understand the "moral imperative" according to the Christian Gospel. *Love one another as I have loved you*, are the words of Jesus in John 13:34. It's the Christian way of summing up the "Golden Rule" – *Do unto others as you would want them to do unto you* (which can be found in Matt 7:13 and Luke 6:31). So, it all begins with love – an unselfish love that is self-giving, not self-seeking, just as Christ modeled on the Cross.

In regards to immigration, and where this principle gets misinterpreted, is in a belief that the Catholic Church wants so -called "open borders." That's not the case. We do want people to be treated with dignity and respect; we are hopeful that as a nation of immigrants there would also be an openness to those of other nations and cultures being admitted to our country if – and this is the important "if" – we have a reasonable certitude that they will be productive citizens.

In his Address to a Joint Session of Congress on September 24, 2015, Pope Francis stated:

Our world is facing a refugee crisis of a magnitude not seen since the Second World War. This presents us with great challenges and many hard decisions. On this continent, too, thousands of persons are led to travel north in search of a better life for themselves and for their loved ones, in search of greater opportunities. Is this not what we want for our own children? We must not be taken aback by their numbers, but rather view them as persons, seeing their faces and listening to their stories, trying to respond as best we can to their situation. To respond in a way which is always humane, just and fraternal. We need to avoid a common temptation nowadays: to discard whatever proves troublesome.

Those last words of our Holy Father are most important. When we create an attitude of indifference or when we just don't want to be bothered, there can be a tendency to move the problem on as fast and as quick as possible. Love and a moral response to the challenge of immigration must involve solutions that first seek to respect and reverence the human person while, only in a secondary way (but still an important way), also assuring the safety and security of our nation and its citizens.

Humanae Vitae – Life, Love and Human Birth

"Married love is also faithful and exclusive of all other, and this until death. This is how husband and wife understand it on the day on which, fully aware of what they are doing, they freely vowed themselves to one another in marriage.

Though this fidelity of husband and wife sometimes

Though this fidelity of husband and wife sometimes presents difficulties, no one has the right to assert that it is impossible; it is, on the contrary, always honorable and meritorious. The example of countless married couples proves not only that fidelity is in accord with the nature of marriage, but also that it is the source of profound and enduring happiness." [Humanae Vitae, no. 9]

Reflection

Throughout salvation history, the story of a faithful God is told over and against the stories of oftentimes unfaithful people. The Israelites made idols in the desert. Out of fear, Jesus' own disciples abandon Him in His greatest time of need. Peter, the first of the Apostles, denies knowing Him. Each time, and throughout history, God, who is "rich in mercy," does not abandon His people. Instead He forgives and saves them again and again and again. God manifests a faithful, exclusive love.

This divine love is the model for marriage – to forsake all others and remain faithful unto death. The call to fidelity is spoken in the vows of marriage and symbolized in the giving of the wedding rings – constant reminders of a couple's love and fidelity to each other "in good times and in bad...."


How and why has our society and its culture turned such a vow as marriage into a meaningless set of words?

❖Stewardship reflection for the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"He instructed them to take nothing for the journey." When Jesus sent his Apostles out, He sent them "two by two," and He basically commanded them to take nothing on the journey: "no food, no sack, no money in their belts." The point of the Lord is that all they needed was to trust in God. Jesus more or less says the same thing to us.

As long as we trust in God, our needs will be met. That is easily said, but it is a bit daunting to actually do it. Yet, people have been doing that since Jesus' time. It is one of the reasons that the Church has thrived for such a long time.

There is a secondary reason for Jesus' instructions though, one with which we may not be familiar. At that time there was a rule that you could not enter a temple area with shoes or a moneybag, because you were there to serve the Lord, nothing else and no one else. The Apostles understood that preaching the Gospel and healing in God's name was holy work. Jesus did not want them to exemplify any other motive either.

One of the foundational elements of stewardship is trusting God. What enables us to be good stewards and to think of giving to God first, of ourselves and what we have, is that we truly believe that God will take care of us. God has a plan for each of us, and it is better than our own plan may be.

ACTIVE PARISHIONER STATUS

We receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings here, or to be godparents or sponsors for the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, and to rightfully enjoy the number of services offered at the Cathedral. Part of that request is to be able to verify that a person is an "active member" of the Cathedral Parish. Because of the nature of our congregation, having so many visitors, it is difficult to know everyone.

An "active member" of this parish is one who:

- Is properly registered and on the parish census
- Faithfully attends Mass on Sundays and Holy Days
 - Participates in parish activities when possible
- Uses the parish envelope system or contributes via Faith Direct While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.

The council lays stress on respect for the human person: everybody should look upon his or her neighbor (without any exception) as another self, bearing in mind especially their neighbor's life and the means needed for a dignified way of life, lest they follow the example of the rich man who ignored Lazarus, who was poor.


