

The **Cathedral Parish Council** meets on Tuesday, October 9 at 6:30 p.m. in the Bishop Baker Parish Center. Among the agenda items will be a discussion and vote on the proposed amendments to the Council's Constitution. ❖ **October 14: Honoring a new Saint!**

Next Sunday, October 14 at the 11:00 a.m. Mass, we will honor one of the Church's newest Saints with a special Mass. Earlier that morning at the Vatican, Pope Francis will canonize Pope Paul VI, adding him to the list of holy men and women of our Church. It was Pope Paul VI who elevated our church – the Cathedral of Saint Augustine – to the honor of "minor basilica" in December 1976. At all Masses next Sunday, a holy card of Pope St. Paul VI and Saint Óscar Romero (another new saint being canonized next Sunday) will be distributed at Masses.

October – The Month of the Rosary

The month of October is traditionally the "Month of the Most Holy Rosary" in the Catholic Church. The feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is October 7 and, thus, the month became a time to focus on this blessed devotion of the faithful.

The Rosary allows us to meditate on the Mysteries of Salvation and how, through Mary, we are invited to fully participate in them. The Paschal Mystery of Christ is our mystery of life, too! Just as Jesus lived, died and was raised up, so we are as well.

Our Legion of Mary has offered to take up the leading of the Rosary on weekdays during Solemn Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. This will begin on Monday, October 1. As pastor, I'm happy to give them this permission to do so. Along with this, the Legion will begin leading the recitation of the Rosary 30 minutes before Masses in the Cathedral on Saturday evenings and Sundays. I hope that these efforts will not only draw us closer to our Lord and Savior through Mary, but also draw us closer to one another as a community of faith.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

On this first Sunday of October, the month traditionally devoted to the Most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, I would like to quote Pope Saint John Paul II from his October 2002 Apostolic Letter *Rosarium Virginis Mariae* ("The Rosary of the Virgin Mary"):

Simple yet profound, it remains, at the dawn of this third millennium, a prayer of great significance, destined to bring forth a harvest of holiness. It blends easily into the spiritual journey of the Christian life.... (§1).

It's important to pray the Rosary. (By the way, the Rosary, as Pope Francis reminded us, is not a piece of jewelry to wear or a decoration!) In meditating upon the various mysteries of the Rosary, each of us can be drawn into Christ's life, death and resurrection. By doing so, we can grow in Divine Love – God's immeasurable, unconditional Love – asking that we might be in union with the Lord of our salvation so we can be more faithful, more hopeful, more charitable.

Monday through Friday our parish prays the Rosary before the Most Blessed Sacrament at noon. Please consider coming by and uniting your voice with others in prayer while meditating on the wondrous mystery of God's Love among us.

❖ **Stewardship reflection for the Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Today's readings give us a wonderful refresher on the Biblical origins of the Sacrament of Marriage, going all the way back to the second chapter of Genesis in our First Reading, and then reinforced by Jesus in our Gospel Reading from St. Mark.

Perhaps more than any other time in Christianity, marriage and family life are under attack right now. It is vital that we have a proper understanding of the Church's beautiful and solid teachings in these areas. We call this type of knowledge "Formation," and it is one of the pillars of a stewardship way of life. Solid formation in the faith not only strengthens us in our own walk with the Lord, but it allows us to pass on this knowledge to others who are thirsting to know the truth about the human person, and it also arms us to defend our beliefs, when necessary.

These readings also invite us to reflect on the reality that we are to be good stewards of the vocation the Lord has entrusted to us. If I am married, do I recognize that my spouse and my marriage are a gift from God that must be nourished, developed and tended? This brings to mind the stewardship aspect of "Time." After time spent with God, my next priority of time should be for my spouse. Do I realize that at the end of my life I will have to give an account to God for how I cared for the gift of my spouse and marriage?

Cathedral Parish Parking: TRUE OR FALSE?

If I have a parish parking permit, I can park in the “Bank of America lot” any time I want.

FALSE. During bank hours, no parishioner parking is allowed in the westernmost 1/3 of the lot. These spaces are exclusively for parking while banking. Provided there is space available, those with a Cathedral Parish parking permit are allowed to park in the easternmost 2/3 of the “Bank of America lot” for any “scheduled” Cathedral services. “Scheduled” events are only the Mass and Confession times published in the bulletin and those events listed in the “This Week in the Parish” column of the bulletin. There is no free parking for any service that is not published in the bulletin such as weddings, funerals, school Masses, etc.
