**SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS AND
COMMEMORATION OF ALL SOULS**

Thursday, November 1 is the Solemnity of All Saints and is a holy day of obligation. The Vigil Mass for the feast will be celebrated at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 31. Masses on Thursday will be at 7:00 and 8:30 a.m., 12:00 noon and 6:00 p.m.

Friday, November 2 is the Commemoration of All Souls. Masses will be at 7:00 and 8:30 a.m. In addition, the First Friday Art Walk Concert at 6:00 p.m. will feature works from the Church's repertoire of hymns and chants, praying for celebrating its faith in the resurrection of the dead. This will be followed at 7:00 p.m. by Solemn Vespers from the Office of the Dead.

[Please Note: The faithful may receive Holy Communion up to three times on November 2 as long as they participate in the full Mass each time.]



Remember that Daylight Savings Time ends next Sunday, November 4 at 2:00 a.m. Before going to bed on Saturday, make sure you set your clocks **back** one hour so you'll be on time for Mass Sunday!!!

[By the way, if you think because the Florida Legislature approved the State remaining on Daylight Savings Time earlier this year means that the above announcement is wrong, sorry.

Until the U.S. Congress acts and agrees to accept the Florida proposal – which as of publication it has not – we still have to follow the time change rules that are in effect.]

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

*"Christ has been raised from the dead,
the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep." [1 Cor 15:20]*

In the Northern Hemisphere it's harvest time. Fall festivals abound as the fruits of the growing season – planted in the spring – are now harvested for food and the other necessities of basic living. The Church has its own "Harvest Festival" each year in the feasts of All Saints and All Souls Day as we celebrate the love of God harvesting His faithful to Him.

The Gospel of John quotes Jesus as saying: *"This is the will of Him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all he has given me, but raise it on the last day"* (Jn 6:39). Along with the above quote from Saint Paul, these are the scriptural references that allow us to focus our celebrations later this week. God's harvest includes those who the Church acknowledges to have led lives of heroic virtue as well as many others known only to God. It also embraces all the faithful departed – those claimed for Christ in the waters of Baptism as well as the unbaptized, "all who were pleasing to you at their passing from this life," (Eucharistic Prayer III) – as we await the Great Day of Judgement when our Lord's Harvest will be completed.

Until that Great Day, the Church celebrates its Saints and prays for its beloved dead. Thus, November 1 and 2 are some of the most important days in our Church's calendar. Please note the times of liturgies and the special First Friday Art Walk Concert scheduled for this week. I hope you will join us as we celebrate and remember all the members of our **family of faith!**

❖ **Stewardship reflection for the Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

As Christian stewards we are called to devote a regular portion of our time to God in prayer. Perhaps we find it intimidating to find the right words when approaching our perfect and all-holy God.

Today's Gospel shows us we need to have our "act together" before we can spend time with Him in prayer. In this passage from Mark, we see that Bartimaeus received a powerful answer to prayer at a very low point in his life. There he sat, begging at the side of the road in a very undignified manner. His posture wasn't exactly reverent, and his prayer wasn't eloquent, just a desperate, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me."

But it was a sincere cry from his heart. And Jesus, though surrounded by a sizable crowd, heard it, and called for Bartimaeus to come to Him. Folks from the crowd called to Bartimaeus, "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you." And right there on the spot, Bartimaeus experienced a profound moment of personal encounter with our Lord and the healing of his vision he desired.

How simple it is to encounter Jesus! All we must do is reach out to Him in prayer and we can be assured that He will hear us and call us to Himself. So let's all take courage this week knowing that Jesus is calling us right now to spend time with Him just as we are, in all our weakness and brokenness. Tell Him, the great High Priest, what your needs are and then, like Bartimaeus, follow Him, and keep on keeping on in this stewardship way of life. It's a life with the ultimate happy ending.

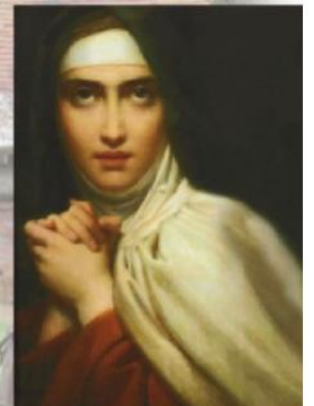

PARTIALLY TRUE. Parishioners do not have to rush to their vehicles after Mass. A limited amount of time is allowed for visiting after Mass or for coffee and donuts, etc. For the 5 p.m. Masses, vehicles must exit the lot by 6:45 p.m.; 7 a.m. Mass by 8:45 a.m.; 9 a.m. Mass by 10:45 a.m.; and 11 a.m. Mass by 12:45 p.m. Vehicles left in the lot after those times will be required to pay when exiting the lot.
