FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

In mid-October I was able to take a week of vacation. Because I needed to be in New York City for a consultation on a church renovation, I decided to start my "days off" once I had finished that work. Autumn in New England is a wonderful time. The crisp, cool mornings and the beautiful tapestry of colors amid rolling hills and mountains is a great experience.

On a Sunday afternoon stroll at a state park in Massachusetts, as the leaves crunched beneath my every step, the symbols of grace from the beauty of nature (God's glorious Creation) were apparent. Leaves of green that proclaimed the glory of the Risen Christ as they appeared in the Spring had passed through their life cycle, were dead and now awaited a kind of burial in the winter's snow, yet to come. The liturgical year of the Church journeys the faithful through this cycle again and again, year in and year-out -- from birth to life to death. This is our life cycle, too. And it's the cycle that Jesus, the Son of God, fully experienced as he came among us, through the Blessed Virgin Mary, to share our life.

Death is a part of life. But for Christians our belief that Jesus has triumphed over death brings about new beginnings that are eternal. November and the early weeks of Advent which are right around the corner are the Church's time to remind us of this reality AND the transformative grace that comes from God alone.







Cathedral Parish Parking: TRUE OR FALSE?

If I have a parish parking permit, I can leave my vehicle in the "Bank of America lot" after Mass.

PARTIALLY TRUE. Parishioners do not have to rush to their vehicles after Mass. A limited amount of time is allowed for visiting after Mass or for coffee and donuts, etc. For the 5 p.m. Masses, vehicles must exit the lot by 6:45 p.m.; 7 a.m. Mass by 8:45 a.m.; 9 a.m. Mass by 10:45 a.m.; and 11 a.m. Mass by 12:45 p.m. Vehicles left in the lot after those times will be required to pay when exiting the lot.

Mission Statement of the Cathedral Parish St. Augustine, Florida

May a Roman Catholic receive Holy Communion at another religious denomination's services?

The easiest answer to this is "no." However, like everything in law (both church and civil), there are exceptions to the rule.

First, a Catholic may not, under any circumstance, receive Communion in a Protestant church's religious service. This is covered in the Church's Code of Canon Law, canon 844. Just as non-Catholic Christians are not generally permitted to receive Holy Communion at a Catholic liturgy, neither may Catholics receive at a Protestant church. The Holy See's Instruction Redemptionis Sacramentum (issued in March 2004) reiterates this in paragraph 84.

Now for the exception: if a baptized Roman Catholic who has already received first Holy Communion is present for the celebration of the Eucharist in one of the "uniate" Catholic Churches, e.g., Byzantine Catholic, Maronite Catholic, etc., then the Roman Catholic may receive Holy Communion. In the Orthodox Churches, while Roman Catholic law would permit you to receive, the laws of the Orthodox Church do not. So, in this latter case, it is best to check with the Orthodox priest who is the celebrant of the Eucharist to see if he would permit you to receive.

Roman Catholic Norms for Those Who Serve as a Godparent or Sponsor

The role of those who serve as godparents and sponsors in the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation is vitally important in the life of the Catholic Church. Those who are chosen for these roles are to show the person for whom they serve as godparent/ sponsor a strong commitment to living the Catholic faith. And so, the Church has set up a minimum set of norms for godparents/ sponsors:

- •The godparent/sponsor must be designated by the one being baptized or confirmed;
- •In the case of infants being baptized, it is the parents who designate the godparents;
- Parents may never serve as godparents/sponsors for their children;
- •The godparent/sponsor must be a practicing Roman Catholic, be at least 16 years old and have received the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist);
- •They must be actively and regularly practicing the faith; if they are married, the Church must be able to recognize the marriage as sacramental.

In the United States, if the godparent/sponsor is not known to the pastor, a letter or affidavit is usually obtained from the person's parish stating that the person is a Catholic in good standing and may serve as a godparent/sponsor.

In the case of Baptism, a person may have two godparents; however, one must be male and the other female. A non-Catholic Christian may serve as a godparent, but they are listed as a "Christian witness" and the other godparent must fulfill the above norms.


