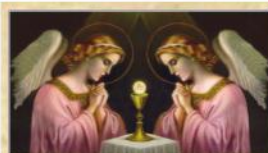

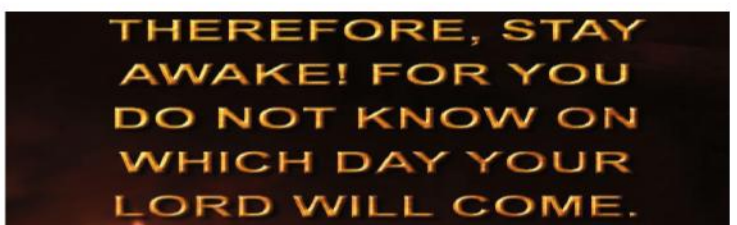

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Welcome to a new Year of Grace! As the Church observes the First Sunday of Advent, a new liturgical year begins – in Church lingo the Year of Grace 2020. This year that begins today will take us to November 28, 2020. And within this Year of Grace, the Diocese of St. Augustine will celebrate its 150th Anniversary – our sesquicentennial. (More on those celebrations later.)

I've written in this column before that Advent is my favorite season of the Church year. Despite the reality that it has been lost in the commotion of the secular "Christmas" observance, Advent calls the true follower of Christ to walk to the beat of different drummer. (Maybe that little drummer boy of Christmas carol fame has something to teach us!) Anyway, Pope Francis also reminds us of Advent's spiritual importance:

"The season of Advent restores ... a hope which does not disappoint for it is founded on God's Word. A hope which does not disappoint, simply because the Lord never disappoints! ... Let us reflect upon and feel this beauty."

One writer caught, for me, one of the reasons we have lost Advent and Christmas: a culture that is caught up more in the swifter currents of consumerism and efficiency instead of the venerable rhythms of Redemption in Christ. Christian hope relies on not getting the quick fix. The path to our salvation in Christ took hundreds of years to get to following the first sin of Adam and Eve. The path to God's final coming at the end of time must keep us vigilant over time. Focused on God's Holy Word, we can find the path to hope and patient waiting. After all, we heard Jesus tell us a few Sundays ago in the Gospel: *By your perseverance you will gain your souls* (Luke 21:19).

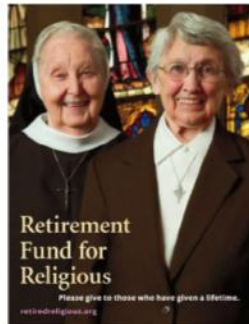

ACTIVE PARISHIONER STATUS

We receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings here, or to be godparents or sponsors for the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, and to rightfully enjoy the number of services offered at the Cathedral. Part of that request is to be able to verify that a person is an "active member" of the Cathedral Parish. Because of the nature of our congregation, having so many visitors, it is difficult to know everyone.

An "active member" of this parish is one who:

- Is properly registered and on the parish census
 - Faithfully attends Mass on Sundays and Holy Days
 - Participates in parish activities when possible
 - Uses the parish envelope system or contributes via Faith Direct
- While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.

Saint Andrew Christmas Novena

Christmas Anticipation Prayer

While a novena is normally a nine-day prayer, the term is sometimes used for any prayer that is repeated over a series of days. The Saint Andrew Christmas Novena is often called simply the "Christmas Novena" or the "Christmas Anticipation Prayer," because it is prayed 15 times every day from the Feast of Saint Andrew the Apostle (November 30) until Christmas. The First Sunday of Advent is the Sunday closest to the Feast of Saint Andrew.

The novena is not actually addressed to Saint Andrew but to God Himself, asking Him to grant our request in the honor of the birth of His Son at Christmas. You can say the prayer all 15 times, all at once; or divide up the recitation as necessary (perhaps five times at each meal). Another idea is to set your cell phone alarm to ring a gentle chime every hour on the hour during your waking hours.

Prayed as a family, the Saint Andrew Christmas Novena is a very good way to help focus the attention of your children on the Advent season.



Saint Andrew Christmas Novena

Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in piercing cold.

In that hour, vouchsafe, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires, through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His Blessed Mother. Amen.
