"Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised from the dead, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us," is present in many ways to his Church: in his word, in his Church's prayer, "where two or three are gathered in my name," in the poor, the sick, and the imprisoned, in the sacraments of which he is the author, in the sacrifice of the Mass, and in the person of the minister. But "he is present . . . most especially in the Eucharistic species."



### ST. JAMES THE GREATER AND THE CAMINO DE LA UNIDAD

The Cathedral Basilica of St. Augustine is a founding member of the Alliance of Cathedrals and serves as the cornerstone of the Camino de la Unidad. It has been designated as the starting point for perceptinos (pilgrims) departing for the Camino de Santiago de Compostela (The Way of St. James in Spain), as well as the starting point for the Camino de la Unidad of the Americas (North, Central, and South America). This Statue of St. James was installed in a temporary position on July 25, 2022 (Feast of St. James the Greater, Apostle) in our Cathedral. The statue was specially carved from cedar and painted to strongly resemble the statue of St. James that sits on top of the Tree of Jesse in the Portico de la Gioria in the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela. There are plans to begin the construction of a special shrine to St. James ton the West Courtyard of the Cathedral Basilica, SAINT JAMES, PRAY FOR US.

# A BLESSED PAST, A BUILDING FOR THE FUTURED

### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

This week's campaign FAQs focus on how the Cathedral's *A Blessed Past*, *A Building for the Future* Capital Campaign and rectory construction project will impact parish life, now and when complete.

# How will this renovation satisfy the parish's need for more event space/a formal parish ball?

The renovation plans include opening up the Verot Room to the existing dining room by eliminating the bookcases flanking the fireplace. French doors will be installed into the courtyard to create an indoor-outdoor event space. Shade structures will be added to the courtyard so that it can be used regardless of the weather. This expanded indoor space will accommodate up to 65 people and can be used for post-Mass events, as well as funeral and small wedding receptions.

# Will parishioners be able to tour the rectory and learn more about the extent of the disrepair and renovation plans?

To protect our priests' privacy, group tours will not be offered. However, a comprehensive video is being developed that will show the extent of the disrepair and how these spaces will be improved with the renovation. In addition, information sessions will be held after Masses on March 9 and 10 so that parishioners can view the plans and ask questions.

#### How will construction impact parish life?

This spring, the Cathedral priests and parish staff will move to temporary spaces for the duration of the renovation, mostly likely a year. The temporary parish office will be located at St. Benedict's Rectory. The temporary priest residence is being provided by a diocesan donor. Vacating the current premises allows our contractor – Auld and White – to prepare for construction. Parish Council and OCIA are the only groups currently meeting regularly at the rectory. Alternative arrangements will be made for the Council at the parish hall and OCIA in the Cathedral.






