





The Most Reverend Erik T. Pohlmeier will be celebrating the Feast Day of St. Benedict the Moor

at the 8:00 am Mass at St. Benedict's on Sunday, March 24, 2024.

Benedict the Moor, OFM (Italian: Benedetto il Moro; 1526 – 4 April 1589) was a Sicilian Franciscan friar. Born of enslaved Africans in San Fratello, he was freed at birth and became known for his charity.

As a young man he joined a Franciscan-affiliated hermit group, of which he became the leader. In 1564 he was sent to the Franciscan friary in Palermo, where he continued good works. He died in 1589 and was canonized as a Catholic saint by Pope Pius VII in 1807.

ST. JAMES THE GREATER AND THE CAMINO DE LA UNIDAD

The Cathedral Basilica of St. Augustine is a founding member of the Alliance of Cathedrals and serves as the cornerstone of the Camino de la Unidad. It has been designated as the starting point for peregrinos (pligrims) departing for the Camino de Santlago de Compostela (The Way of St. James in Spain), as well as the starting point for the Camino de la Unidad of the Americas (North, Central, and South America). This Statue of St. James was installed in a temporary position on July 25, 2022 (Feast of St. James the Greater, Apostle) in our Cathedral. The statue was specially carved from cedar and painted to strongly resemble the statue of St. James that sits on top of the Tree of Jesse in the Portico de la Gloria in the Cathedral of Santlago de Compostela. There are plans to begin the construction of a special shrine to St. James tna the West Courtyard of the Cathedral Basilica. SAINT JAMES, PRAY FOR US.



During the season of Lent, those who have been preparing to be initiated into the Life of Christ through the Church's Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist are in a final, 40-day journey to celebrate the Paschal Mystery. Those who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil are now called the Elect. Others who will be received into Full Communion with the Catholic Church are called, as are all of us who are already baptized, to continuing conversion of life.

Today the Elect celebrate the Second Scrutiny with our parish community at the 9:00 a.m. Mass. Readings for that Mass will use the Scrutiny Year A Readings as specified by the USCCB. These rites call upon the Elect to honestly look at their lives and find where sin still abounds and affects them. We, as the community of faith, are not only asked to pray for them, but also to realize our need to turn from sin: "Repent and believe in the Gospel" (Mk 1:15).

Please remember the Elect in your prayers!


"Minorcan" Open Day at Tolomato Cemetery Saturday, March 16, 2024


