

Benedict the Moor, OFM (Italian: Benedetto il Moro; 1526 – 4 April 1589) was a Sicilian Franciscan friar. Born of enslaved Africans in San Fratello, he was freed at birth and became known for his charity.

As a young man he joined a Franciscan-affiliated hermit group, of which he became the leader. In 1564 he was sent to the Franciscan friary in Palermo, where he continued good works. He died in 1589 and was canonized as a Catholic saint by Pope Pius VII in 1807.

PALM SUNDAY AND BLESSING OF THE FLEET

Next Sunday is Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion. On this day we will remember Jesus' entry into Jerusalem in the days leading up to His Passion, Death and Resurrection. We will also hear the Passion Narrative, this year from the Gospel of Saint Mark. Since this Gospel was most likely the first to be written, it's also the first written narrative we have of Jesus' Passion and Death. Like so much of this Gospel, the Narrative moves swiftly and quickly. One Scripture scholar has termed Mark's Gospel as the Gospel of action and passion!

On Palm Sunday, the 11:00 a.m. Mass begins in the West Courtyard of the Cathedral. There **Bishop Erik Pohlmeier** will preside at the Procession and Blessing of Palms. Then Mass will be celebrated, followed by our City's annual tradition of the Blessing of the Fleet and procession of the St. Augustine Royal Family. It's a wonderful day filled with pageantry and the solemnity of the liturgical rites of our Catholic faith.



Sacrament of Penance Reminders

Five Steps For a Good Confession

- 1. Do a thorough Examination of Conscience.
- 2. Be sincerely sorry for your sins.
- 3. Confess your sins to a priest.
- 4. Resolve to amend your life.
- After your confession, do the penance the priest assigns.



How to go to Confession

- 1. The priest welcomes you and you make the sign of the cross.
- You say: "Bless me Father, for I have sinned. It has been _ weeks/months/years since my last confession.
- 3. Confess your sins to the priest (mortal and venial sins).
- 4. Say: "For these and all the sins of my past, I am sorry."
- 5. Listen to the advice the priest gives you.
- The priest will give you a penance to complete after you leave the confessional.
- 7. Pray the Act of Contrition.
- 8. The priest gives you absolution.
- 9. After leaving, complete your penance.

Act of Contrition

I firmly intend, with Your help, to do penance, to sin no more,

river, celebrated a beautiful Mass, individually reflected for an hour of silence with God and His nature, and enjoyed picnicking fellowship. Amen!


Family of the Month - The Speidel's


Lent and the Rites of Christian Initiation - The Third Scruting

During the season of Lent, those who have been preparing to be initiated into the Life of Christ through the Church's Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist are in a final, 40-day journey to celebrate the Paschal Mystery. Those who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil are now called the Elect. Others who will be received into Full Communion with the Catholic Church are called, as are all of us who are already baptized, to continuing conversion of life.

Today the Elect celebrate the Third Scrutiny with our parish community at the 9:00 a.m. Mass. Readings for that Mass will use the Scrutiny Year A Readings as specified by the USCCB. These rites call upon the Elect to honestly look at their lives and find where sin still abounds and affects them. We, as the community of faith, are not only asked to pray for them, but also to realize our need to turn from sin: "Repent and believe in the Gospel" (Mk 1:15). Please remember the Elect in your prayers!



ST. JAMES THE GREATER AND THE CAMINO DE LA UNIDAD The Cathedral Basilica of St. Augustine is a founding member of the Alliance of Cathedrals and serves as the cornerstone of the Camino de la Unidad. It has been designated as the starting point for

It has been designated as the starting point for peregrinos (pilgrims) departing for the Camino de Santiago de Compostela (The Way of St. James in Spain), as well as the starting point for the Camino de la Unidad of the Americas (North, Central, and South America). This Statue of St. James was installed in a temporary position on July 25, 2022 (Feast of St. James the Greater, Apostle) in our Cathedral. The statue was specially carved from cedar and painted to strongly resemble the statue of St. James that sits on top of the Tree of Jesse in the Portico de la Gloria in the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela. There are plans to begin the construction of a special shrine to St. James in the West Courtyard of the Cathedral Basilica. SAINT JAMES, PRAY FOR US.




