RECTORY RENOVATION UPDATE



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

fter just a few weeks, the Cathedral's A Blessed Past, A Building for the Future Capital Campaign has hit an exciting milestone. After Easter, we officially surpassed the \$1M mark. Our next goal post is \$2.1M or the Father Camps Goal. At that point, we will have the funds required to upgrade the rectory's electrical and plumbing systems, restore all 75 windows to help with energy efficiency and noise, and make the rectory more accessible with wider doorways and bathrooms that meet ADA standards.

This campaign depends upon a team of dedicated parishioners. On their behalf, please remember the following if you get a call from someone on our team:

- These are volunteers, many of whom are juggling their campaign responsibilities between work, family and other parish commitments.
- Please be kind if you hear from a volunteer. If they leave a
 message, be courteous and respond to their call.
- Consider the meeting they are requesting an opportunity to build our faith community at the Cathedral.

Thank you for the generosity so many of you have already extended to this effort. I look forward to sharing more good news in the weeks ahead.






