



ST. JAMES THE GREATER AND THE CAMINO DE LA UNIDAD

The Cathedral Basilica of St. Augustine is a founding member of the Alliance of Cathedrals and serves as the cornerstone of the Camino de la Unidad. It has been designated as the starting point for peregrinos (pilgrims) departing for the Camino de Santiago de Compostela (The Way of St. James in Spain), as well as the starting point for the Camino de la Unidad of the Americas (North, Central, and South America). This Statue of St. James was installed in a temporary position on July 25, 2022 (Feast of St. James the Greater, Apostle) in our Cathedral. The statue was specially carved from cedar and painted to strongly resemble the statue of St. James that sits on top of the Tree of Jesse in the Portico de la Gloria in the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela. There are plans to begin the construction of a special shrine to St. James in the West Courtyard of the Cathedral Basilica. SAINT JAMES, PRAY FOR US.




